I had the privilege of hearing Mark Lowry sing his song “Mary Did You Know?” a few weeks ago at the Women of Faith conference in Hartford. It was so powerful it brought tears to my eyes. Mary really had no idea what the road ahead would hold, but she said “yes” to God because she was faithful to the Lord’s call on her life. She was not saying “yes” to a known future. She was saying “yes” to the person of God. She trusted in his character; because of her love for

the Lord she was willing to walk into a future of His choosing. Truly, there is no greater purpose than living into God’s purpose for us. However, doing so can truly be a leap of faith, because he has a way of revealing his purpose, his direction for us, one step at a time.

It is said, “Yesterday is history, tomorrow is a mystery, today is a gift”. We are only able to experience today as a gift if we receive it as such and trust that our future is in the hands of the Lord who loves us more than we can imagine. We receive the present as a gift not because our circumstances meet our hopes and expectations but because we trust the giver. I once heard someone describe time as a river that we are standing in the middle of. The past has flowed downstream—it is beyond us and can’t be changed or relived. The future is still upstream and there is no way we can know what is coming. But when we have given our lives to Christ, he is standing right beside us in the river giving us the strength and courage to deal with whatever comes our way. He is with us in the present giving us the grace we need in that moment for whatever we might be facing at the time.

When Mary said “yes” to God, she had no idea what was coming. Some of it was more wonderful than she could have dreamed possible, other parts most certainly would have made her want to run the other way. Yet, as she lived it, the Lord gave her the grace, the strength, and the courage to live through it all for her good, the good of others, and the glory of God. Who could ask for anything more?

So this Advent, experience the present as a gift; knowing the King of Kings is right there with you in the midst of it. Look to him for the grace, the strength, and the joy to live for the good of others and the glory of God. In so doing, you will find that it is indeed a gift beyond anything the world can give even if it is only in hindsight that we can recognize it as such.

(There will be a special performance of Mark Lowry’s song, “Mary Did You Know” by a guest performer during the 10:00 service on December 16th.)

Try Evening Prayer during Advent

Beat the unfortunate stress created by our culture during the Christmas/New Year holiday season by attending Evening Prayer in St. Peter's Chapel at 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

Evening Prayer, a liturgy found in the Book of Common Prayer for late afternoon or early evening which can be led by a layperson, offers a superb and contemplative way to "let go" of the day's burdens and frustrations while also celebrating the day's joys.

Each day's service is led by a layperson and is about 30 minutes in duration. You do not have to attend every day, although that could be a beneficial Advent discipline.

Parishioners Take 'Safe Church' Training

More than two dozen members of St. Peter's — including Vestry members, church officers, Christian Formation teachers and Lay Eucharistic Ministers — attended a day-long "Safe Church Training" seminar conducted by the Diocese of Connecticut and hosted by St. Peter's in the Clemence-Memorial Parish Hall on Sept. 29. The training was open to parishioners and staff from throughout the Diocese and approximately 100 people attended.

The training covered three major areas for a safe and healthy church: enhancing the safety of ministry with adults, which focused on clergy and parishioner misconduct; protection of children, and youth and protection of elders. The program included a detailed and updated explanation of mandated reporting requirements under Connecticut state law and an outline of the Diocese of Connecticut's new process for handling complaints once a misconduct or abuse complaint is filed.

"Safe Church Training" is required every three years for any adult in a parish who works with children or visits parishioners. Each participant on Sept. 29 received certification of completion of the full course and in the future will need only attend short "refresher" training to maintain their certification.

Have you met the Greens



Deirdre (Dee), Conrad, Natalie, and Curtis? You may have seen them working and helping around St. Peter's. Dee was born and raised in Milford and was baptized and confirmed at St. Peter's. In fact, she grew up and currently lives in the same neighborhood, the Orange Avenue-Locust Street area. Her mother, Jean Shelton is also a member of St. Peter's and lives next door.

Dee worked as a lab technician for several years before deciding to go back to school to become a teacher. She attended Quinnipiac University and received a master degree in teaching. Dee says,

"Being a teacher is inherited, my mother and my aunts were all teachers." For the past 16 years, Dee has been teaching seventh grade science at Hamden Middle School. Dee recently obtained a Certificate of Advanced Studies from Sacred Heart University.

Dee serves on the Vestry during this very trying period and she, and all the members, of the Vestry deserve our prayers and heartfelt thanks. Dee leads evening prayer on Wednesday evening. She is also a Lay Eucharistic Minister, participates in Outreach Dinners, and has in the past chaired the fellowship group. Outside church she belongs to the Soroptimist woman's club. This is a non-profit organization that helps women and girls in need.

Conrad was born in Houlton, Maine and has moved so much he says he can no longer remember how many times. He says "His family moved back and forth from Maine to Connecticut twice before finally settling in Milford in 1966, and all before fourth grade".

Conrad joined the US Army in 1975 near the end of the Vietnam War and served for three years. Conrad was employed by the City of Milford as a mechanic. While working for the City, Conrad decided to take some computer classes. One thing led to another and in 2006 he graduated with high honors with an Associate's degree in Computer Science from Housatonic Community College. Conrad retired in June 2011 and is now known as Mr. Fix-it at St. Peter's. Recently he and Paul Smith painted the Rector's office. He installed a sound system in the Parish Hall and has also worked on the sound system in the church and is helping to plan an upgrade for that system. He says "He is a Jack of all trades and a master of none".

Natalie graduated from Foran High School in 2007. She continued her education at SUNY Albany and graduated this year with a Bachelor's degree in English. While in her final year at SUNY Albany, she participated in a study abroad program in Tanzania, Africa. She worked teaching students about HIV/AIDS, vaccinated chickens, and taught sustainable farming techniques. She is currently pursuing her Master's in teaching at the University of Bridgeport. What was that saying about the apple and the tree again? Curtis graduated from Foran High School in 2009. Curtis has worked seasonally as custodian at Orange Ave School. Curtis has also worked in construction and is currently looking for work.

The Greens have been on mission trips to Juarez, Mexico to build a home for a needy Christian family. Conrad and Dee have gone four times, Curtis has gone three times, and Natalie has been twice. These trips have deeply affected their lives. "It was amazing to get so close to the families, leaving Mexico was like leaving part of our family." Conrad said, "When you see the poverty and the way the people live you think to yourself; these people must be miserable, but they are not. They live with what they have and they are quite happy. I have to ask myself, if these people can live with what little they have, why is it that I need so much more? The answer is I don't."


