One of my favorite seminary professors was my Old Testament professor who instilled in us a love for the Old Testament and an understanding of its importance in having a richer understanding of the New Testament. A key example of this is that our understanding of the Passover, which is the celebration of the liberation of the Jews from bondage as slaves in Egypt, informs our understanding of Holy Week and Easter as well as our understanding of the Holy Eucharist (Communion).

Jesus was truly the Lamb of God sacrificed for us freeing us from our bondage to sin and death. Because of his blood shed for us (Remember the lamb's blood painted on the doorposts of the Hebrew people, so the angel of death would pass over them.) our sins have been forgiven (passed over) and we are given the gift of eternal life with the Lord.

My beloved Old Testament professor taught us the word "anamnesis". It means to remember as if you were there and are reliving the experience in your remembering. In the Passover celebration this process of remembering is aided by the line assigned to the youngest child who is instructed to ask, "Why is this night different from all other nights?" This is the way we are meant to experience the liturgy of the Holy Week services culminating in Easter Sunday—to remember them as if we are experiencing those very events; to imagine we are there. This is not play acting. It is a realization that the very real events have a very real impact on our lives right now and for all eternity. What Jesus has accomplished for us has the power to change everything when we embrace the truth of His gift of love and forgiveness and experience that restored relationship with our heavenly Father. And so we remember as if we were there then, because we are there now. We are experiencing the abundance of God's blessings poured out for us when we are living the resurrection in our lives.

## Caring for your children

St. Peter's is pleased to care for your young children during the 10:00 a.m. service. Childcare is available for children through age 3. A trained special education/elementary education teacher, Amanda Sayers, and an assistant caregiver, who has participated in Red Cross and Safe Church training, provide care for the children in the nursery on the second floor of the education building. **True Spirituality** is part of the *Living on the Edge* series by Chip Ingram. This study meets on Wednesday evenings 6:30 p.m. - 8:30 p.m., beginning with dinner. This powerful study removes the clutter and presents a clear, compelling, Biblical picture of a true disciple of Jesus. ## Do You Want to Hear from God?

*"I will climb up to my watchtower and stand at my guardpost. There I will wait to see what the LORD says and how he will answer." (Habakkuk 2:1 NLT)*

Hearing from God starts with a desire. You have to want to hear from God!

Habakkuk 2:1 says, "*I will climb up to my watchtower and stand at my guardpost. There I will wait to see what the LORD says and how he will answer*" (NLT). Habakkuk begins with these words: "I will." In other words, he's saying that he is deciding to listen to God. It's a choice.

You're never going to hear God unless you want to hear God. It's just that simple. God speaks to those who decide in advance that they're going to do

whatever God tells them to do before he even tells them. He does not play games. He wants you to desire communication with him and for you to say, "God, you tell me what to do, and I'll do it." Once you decide you want to hear from God, you have to withdraw to a quiet place. Habakkuk 2:1 says, "*I will climb up to my watchtower*," which is a Hebrew expression that means to get alone. You cannot hear God's voice if you're surrounded by noise. That's why you've got to find a quiet place. Would you agree that it's tough to find a quiet place in today's world? How about in your own house? Parents of preschoolers know what I'm talking about.

Let me give you parents a little encouragement. Susanna Wesley had 18 children, and two of her sons changed history. John Wesley was the founder of the Methodist church, and Charles Wesley wrote hundreds of Christian hymns. Both of them attributed their love for God to their mom's passionate dedication to the Lord. She prayed every day. How do you find time to withdraw and pray every day when you have 18 kids? Sometime in the afternoon, she would sit down in her rocking chair and pull her long apron up over her head. All the kids knew that if they disturbed mom when the apron was over her head, they were in for it!


Jesus gives us some very specific advice in Matthew 6:6: "*Find a quiet, secluded place so you won't be tempted to role-play before God. Just be there as simply and honestly as you can manage. The focus will shift from you to God, and you will begin to sense his grace*" (MSG).

There are two words that will motivate your decision to withdraw and get away with the Lord: God cares. God cares about what you're going through. If you don't realize that he cares, why would you want to spend any time with him? Once you realize how much he cares, how much grace he has to give to you, then you'll make the decision to withdraw and be with him.


