The way we use our time, talent, and treasure, what we call the stewardship of our gifts in church speak, tells a great deal about our relationship with the Lord. Scripture says, "Where your treasure is there will your heart be also." (Matt. 6:21) We spend our time, talent and our money on those things that are important to us. We invest in things that we think are worthwhile investments or that will have a high return on our investment in the future. But often we fail to link the way we spend our money and time with our spiritual lives, even though when we are

experiencing a need or a shortfall we take it to the Lord in prayer. So much about our spiritual journey is a matter of learning to trust God and learning that God is worthy of our trust. When we experience this in tangible ways through a healing, an unexpected provision or blessing, or some other answer to prayer, our trust is increased and our faith in God strengthened. Most of us feel like we have plenty of needs to give God opportunity to build our faith through answered prayer without going out on a limb to provide more opportunity! However scripture calls us to trust God in all things and to build that trust through giving back to God out of the first fruits of our labor in gratitude to God. That means taking a step of faith and giving to the Lord out front rather than waiting to see if anything is leftover. I have found that when I give to God off the top there is enough but if I wait till the end I find myself with not even enough to meet my own needs.

In reading an article about the importance of developing physical core strength, I found myself recognizing parallels to faithful stewardship and the spiritual core strength it develops in our walk with the Lord. Developing our physical core strength is not just about looking good; it's your body's powerhouse. It is necessary to have a strong core to facilitate movement, prevent injuries, and move about pain free, but our core also houses our inner organs and our central nervous system so a healthy core provides a strong foundation and support for everything else to be strong and healthy. Likewise, being good stewards of all that God has given and honoring God in the way we use those gifts- our money, our time, our talents, our relationships, and, yes, even our bodies, is at the core of having a healthy and happy life and having a strong relationship with the Lord. When we are obedient to God in our lives, He blesses that area that we have demonstrated faithfulness in- healthy finances, healthy relationships, a healthy approach to the way we use our time and our gifts, and physical health. And when we are going through hardship in any of those areas He has developed in us the ability to trust Him and to lean on Him for strength so that we will be upheld through the challenge.

Caring for your children

St. Peter's is pleased to care for your young children during the 10:00 a.m. service. Childcare is available for children through age 3. A trained special education/elementary education teacher, Amanda Sayers, and an assistant caregiver, who has participated in Red Cross and Safe Church training, provide care for the children in the nursery on the second floor of the education building. An usher will be happy to assist you in locating this room. Our Church School program meets during the 10:00 a.m. service for children ages 3-12. They will be led to class by their teachers and returned in time for communion. Visitors are encouraged to have their children participate

Church School meets during the 10:00 a.m. service. The children come to church with their families and are brought up to class by their teachers following the Children's Message. They will be brought back into church in time to have Communion with their families. The younger class (Preschool – First Grade) has a hands-on curriculum playing within the different Bible stories using a story set and activities related to the lesson. The older class (Grades 2-5) uses a Scripture-based curriculum called "Faith Weaver Now" by Group Publishing. Both classes study the Old Testament in the fall and shift to the New Testament for winter and spring

Prove God Through Your Giving

“Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this,” says the Lord Almighty, ‘and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it.’” (Malachi 3:10 NIV)

The Bible says there’s only one way you can prove God: through giving, specifically through tithing.

Malachi 3:9-10 says, *“You are under a curse — your whole nation — because you are robbing me. Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this,” says the Lord Almighty, ‘and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it’” (NIV).*

I’ll never forget the first time I let God test my faith about giving. I was 19 years old, in college, and in debt. I owed my school \$500 that was due at the end of the month. I owed 10 bucks to a friend. And all I had was \$50 in the bank. I knew I couldn’t pay my debts, so I thought, “God says to put him to the test. I may as well try it.”

So I took the \$50 out of the bank and decided I was going to send it to a Christian organization; it didn’t really matter which one. I chose the American Bible Society, which prints Bibles and gives them away. I included a little note that said, “Whoever opens this letter, would you pray for me? I’m a poor, starving college student, and I’ve got some personal debts I need to pay off. I’m just trusting God that when I put him first in my life that he’ll meet all my needs. Please pray!” I didn’t know what was going to happen.

About three weeks later I got invited to speak at a church for a weekend youth event. On Sunday the pastor said, “We took up an offering for you, Rick.” I was really just there to help and had a great time. I never thought about getting paid! I waited until I was back at the dorm to open it. Inside was \$561. I gave the college \$500. I gave my friend \$10. And I took the \$51 and gave it back to God as a tithe. I was still poor, but I wasn’t in debt!


Since then, I’ve done this hundreds of times. I’ve done it with millions of dollars. For 31 years I’ve been playing a game with God where he says, “Rick, you give to me, and I’ll give to you, and we’ll see who wins.” And I have lost that game every time.

You say you trust God with your salvation and your forgiveness and your freedom and your future in Heaven, but do you trust him with your finances? If not, what’s the logic of that?

You have to decide: Do you trust God to keep his promises?
