The Second Month of the Year



The second month of the year, February, does not often come from the lips of many as their favorite. In New England, it's the coldest and stormiest of months. It is the shortest month of the year, as it is the only month to have less than 30 days, with 28 days in common years, and 29 days in leap years. Though some people might get excited about Groundhog Day, Candlemas, Valentine's Day, the births of Abraham Lincoln, and George Washington, and sales associated with

Presidents' Day, and a week of school vacation in some places, it's a tough month for most of us because winter seems to be winning. But I'd like to share some positive things, and save the most positive thing for last.

It's interesting that the color purple is associated with the month, through February's flower being the violet, and its birthstone being the amethyst. The amethyst (literally "not drunk") symbolizes faith, humility, and spiritual wisdom. Perhaps it's because the purple ring of a bishop is taken after the first words of St. Peter preaching on the day of Pentecost, that the people who are filled with the Holy Spirit are not drunk, but rather inflamed by God. Usually, February also has the purple of Lent for at least some of its days. This year Lent begins on March 1, and Easter is late – on April 16.

February is a time to think about our relationship with God, as we prepare for Lent and as the days lengthen toward Easter. It's a time to ask, "Lord, what should I give up?" And, "Lord, what should I take on?" A very good change will be happening in February. You will become acquainted with your next Rector in February (unless that person's name is disclosed sooner!). The work of the Discernment Committee and the Recruitment Committee and the Vestry is nearly complete. February will hardly be lackluster, as you are filled with the knowledge of what God has next for you. We can face this February with joy and hope.

For the Sundays during the season of Lent, our services will follow Rite I in the Book of Common Prayer. This will begin March 5 and continue through Palm Sunday, April 9.

Choral Evensong on February 26th

On Sunday, February 26, at 5:00 p.m., The Choir of St. Peter's will sing Choral Evensong for the Last Sunday after The Epiphany. Choral Evensong is one of the Anglican Church's great gifts to Christian worship. With its perfect blend of contemplation, prayer, and music, it offers a lovely and spiritual way to end the day that has drawn people to the cathedrals of England for four hundred years. On February 26, you can experience this in the comfort and closeness of your own parish!

Music will include the *St. Martin Preces and Responses* by Christopher Drinkell, *Psalm 99* set to Anglican Chant by Samuel Arnold (organist of the Chapel Royal and Westminster Abbey), *Magnificat and Nunc dimittis in C* by C. Hylton Stewart (organist of Rochester Cathedral and St. George's Chapel, Windsor Castle), and *Christ, whose glory fills the skies* by Philip Ledger, past Organist of King's College Chapel, Cambridge.

Anyone, committed Christian or curious visitor, can be touched by Choral Evensong, since the work is largely borne by the Choir as it offers sung prayer on behalf of the congregation. One participates by "active listening" and praying the texts as they are sung by the Choir, as well as by joining in the Hymns and the spoken Prayers. It is a perfect opportunity to bring a friend of any persuasion to experience the great music of the Church surrounded by the beauty of our Nave! Don't miss this last moment of celebration before the austerities of Lent, three days later.

Change Requires Community

“Just as our bodies have many parts and each part has a special function, so it is with Christ’s body. We are many parts of one body, and we all belong to each other” (Romans 12:4-5 NLT, second edition).

You will not make all the changes you need to make, want to make, would love to make, plan to make, or hope to make by yourself. If you could, you would. But you can’t, so you won’t!

The Bible says in Romans 12:4-5, *“Just as our bodies have many parts and each part has a special function, so it is with Christ’s body. We are many parts of one body, and we all belong to each other”* (NLT, second edition).

God wired the universe in such a way that we need each other. I need you, and you need me. The phrase “one another” is used 58 times in the New Testament: Love one another, care for one another, encourage one another, support one another, pray for one another, greet one another, share with one another. God never meant for you to go through life alone. Even the Lone Ranger had Tonto! You weren’t created to go through life by yourself. Whether you ever marry or not is irrelevant. You need a spiritual family, and you need to be in a small group.

You need the people around you, and they need you. We belong to each other.

There are a lot of good self-help books that will tell you the right thing to do, but they don’t provide the two things the Bible says you must have: God’s power and community. That’s what you need to really change. Change requires community.

At Saddleback, we’ve got people from every kind of background. We speak 65 languages at our church and have members from many different religious and ethnic backgrounds and nationalities.

But what we have in common is our love for God. That unites us and allows us to help each other out.

Galatians 3:28 says, *“There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus”* (NIV).

Talk It Over

- What changes do you want to make in your life this year? What goals have you set?
- How will the support of the people closest to you help you accomplish those goals?
- What keeps you from accepting or asking for help from other people?




